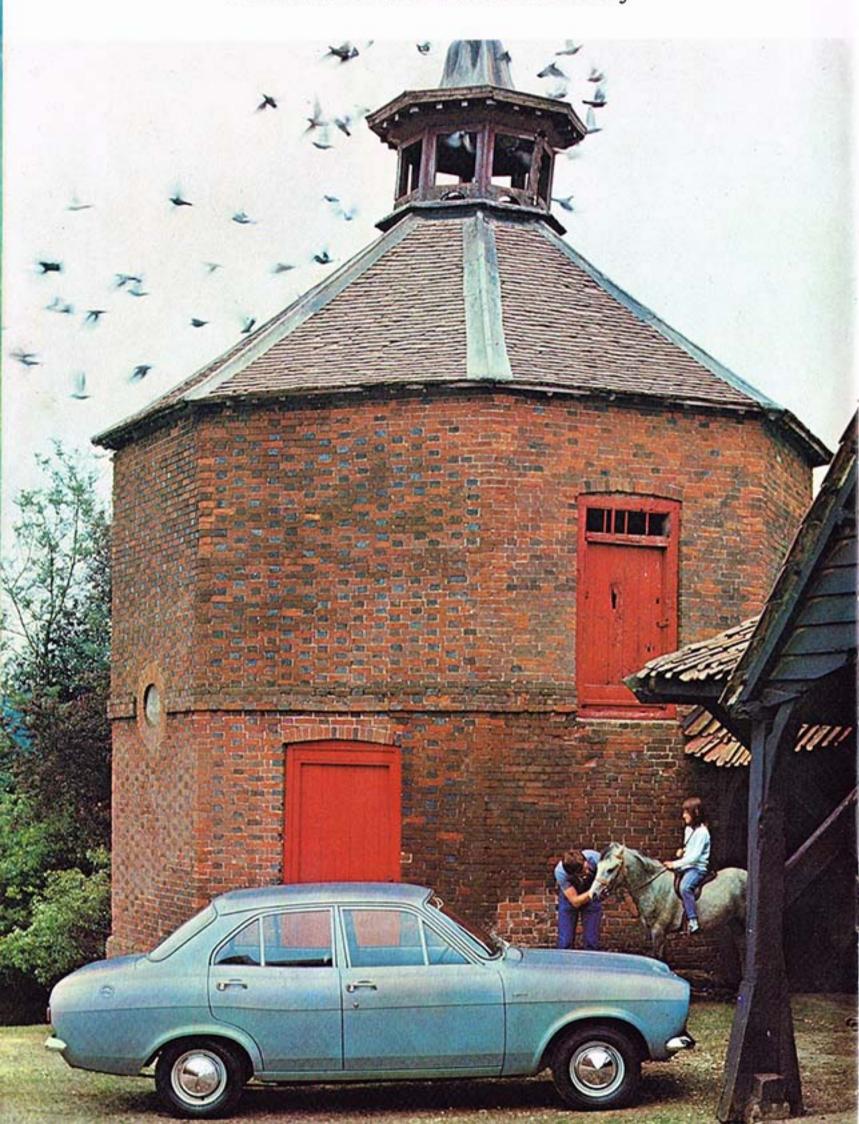
Making changes through competition is doing it the hard way, but it gets

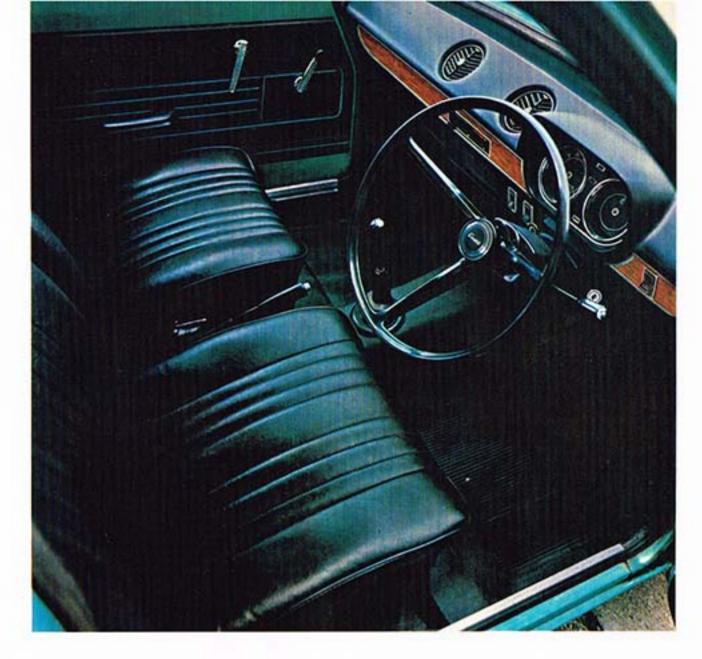


results. Engines have been uprated to give more power without loss of fuel economy, switches relocated for better access, new models have been introduced, and so on. But some things we wouldn't dare change. The attractive shape of the Escort, rounded and handsome, yet functional. The space for four adults with luggage. The small-car nippiness and manoeuvrability. The many built in safety features.

And the choice. With the Escort you don't have to go along with somebody else's idea of what makes a great car: you take the basic idea and adapt it to your requirements. Choose the comfort level you want. Choose the engine. Choose two or four doors. Choose the performance. With the Escort it's up to you.

Escort Standard-Escort Economy





Often you can tell a car by the company it keeps: the film star's Jag., the magnate's Rolls. With the Escort this sort of classification is difficult – it's such a practical car that all sorts of people buy it, regardless of its status value, either as a first or second car.

The Escort Standard and Escort Saloon are not "rich men's toys" or "poor men's Rolls", they are quite simply excellent cars for getting about in,

quickly, economically, and comfortably.

But practical doesn't mean sparse. The Escort Saloon, for instance, has individual front bucket seats, with fore-and-aft adjustment and an anti-tip device. They are also very comfortable, and give you fatigue-cutting support on long journeys. Upholstery is smart black PVC, the plush head-lining is easily washable. Ashtrays front and back, heater and demister, face-level ventilation, safety padded facia top, collapsible parcel shelf, door-operated courtesy lights, and other luxury and utility features. Remember, that's the

Escort Saloon. And it also has the inbuilt Escort advantages of a luggage-hungry boot (13.6 cubic feet overall), a tough body of steel integral construction with safety glass all round, and an 1100cc engine with five main bearings, with bowl-in-piston, crossflow cylinder head, and overhead valves.

The Escort Standard offers real economy - all the "gingerbread" of the other models, but with a little less "gilt". In other words, the same great mechanicals and comfort, but without such items as bright metal mouldings, wide choice of paint and interior schemes, passenger sun-visor, padded door panels and facia, driver parcel shelf and rear ashtrays.

Escort Standard owner Kevin Casey puts it like this: "I bought the Escort Standard because I didn't have a lot of money to spare, and I wanted as much basic car as I could get. I'm not against 'trimmings', but with a car as good as the Escort I find I can get

along without them.

Escort L-Escort Comfort





To many people, a car is more than just "seats on wheels". They reason that if you're going to spend some hundreds of pounds on a piece of equipment, it's worth spending a little extra to shape it to indivi-

dual requirements.

The Escort L is packed with items that make motoring more fun, less fuss. Hard-wearing loop-pile carpet throughout – more than just a nice luxury touch, it also helps to make the interior of the Escort L even quieter. A cowlside map pocket helps keep maps in their place and easily to hand. Two speed wipers give you a clearer view, whatever the weather. Grab handles are fitted front and rear, for convenience and safety. Coat hooks are another example of detail thinking, as is a convenience light in the boot, and the mat to protect expensive luggage.

"Safety first" features, like overriders, reversing lamp, and a water temperature gauge are fitted as

standard.

Headlamp glare at night often renders the conventional rear view mirror useless – but not the dipping mirror fitted to the Escort L. With simple ingenuity it cuts night glare to a minimum. Another idea that combines convenience and safety is the foot-operated wiper/washer control – one press sends a jet of water on to the windscreen and gives a few sweeps of the wiper blades – cuts out fumbling for switches, leaves both hands free to steer.

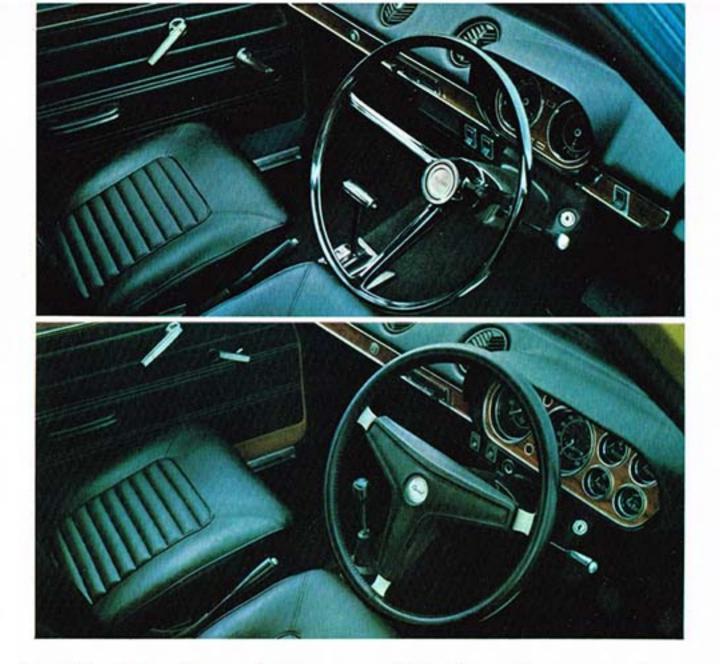
You can have the 1100cc engine on the Escort L. If you'd like a little more performance and accelera-

tion, specify the 1300cc engine.

Escort owner Pete Thurston did. "The larger engine gives my Escort a performance well up with much bigger saloon cars – and the nippy handling gives me a distinct advantage in town traffic. This car's got all the room I need, and when you consider the comfort level . . . well, I think I've got the better bargain, don't you?"

Escort XL & Escort GT-Escort Style, Escort Performance





If you'd like a little more luxury and a little more panache the Escort XL has plenty to offer you. The 1300cc engine (with a top speed of around 90mph), a unique interior trim style, with cool knitted vinyl upholstery, wood capping for the doors, opening rear quarter vents on the rear windows (2 door only), a cigar lighter on the dashboard, chrome gearshift, and a vanity mirror on the passenger sun-visor all this is additional to the features of the Escort L.

Outside, the rectangular headlights are distinctively trimmed. Bright metal mouldings highlight the rear end, and the wheels have slot-styled trim. Bright metal rocker-panel mouldings complement the Escort smooth looks. On the four door model there are bright

window mouldings.

Julie Henderson likes the Escort XL because "it's pretty". But she's hard headed enough to appreciate the more solid benefits. "It's very easy to drive – especially with automatic transmission, which I insisted on. It makes life simple, and it isn't incredibly expensive. Even though it's a small car, it still feels wonderfully plush. And I save on petrol."

But perhaps comfort and appearance aren't

enough for you?

You also like more performance. Then let us

introduce you to the Escort GT.

In many ways the Escort GT is a very surprising car: 1300cc engine, Weber twin-choke carburettor, high-lift cam, bigger valves, four branch exhaust manifold, 82bhp, giving you a standing start to 60mph time of just 12.5 seconds, and a top speed in the nineties. Transferred by a close ratio gearbox with a remote sporty shift. Held firmly on the road by wide (4!") wheels and radial ply tyres. Controlled by front discs, rear drums, and servo assistance all round.

Nick Jenkins used to drive a sports car — "natural ventilation through a tear in the hood" — but opted for the Escort GT after seeing Escorts in competition.

"I realised that this sports car thing was mainly a matter of image. You don't have to be uncomfortable to drive a lively car. The Escort GT has all the performance I need, and then some. Besides, I like the "wolf in sheep's clothing" feeling it gives me."

There's nothing spartan about the interior. Quite the opposite in fact, because the Escort GT is trimmed and furnished to the same level as the Escort XL.—with the exception of the wheel trim and the opening rear quarter vents, vanity mirror and the addition of a larger instrument binnacle with four extra dials containing speedometer, odometer, tachometer, separate fuel gauge, temperature gauge, oil pressure gauge, and battery condition indicator.

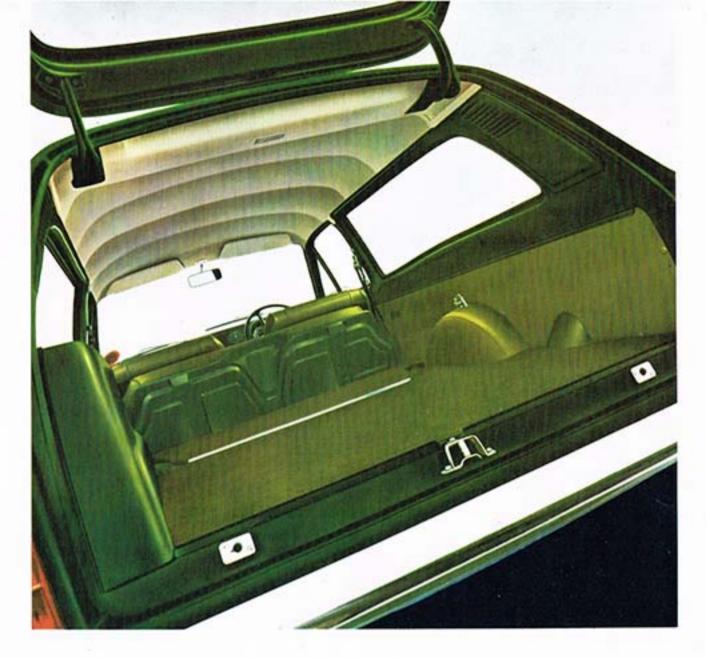
So in Escort GT you get the best of both worlds -

high level of trim—and high performance.

Escort Estates-Escort Space





One of the more practical inventions of the landed gentry was the estate car, a very sensible piece of transport which enabled them to carry around the essential equipment for huntin', shootin' and fishin' without losing face. The idea has been eagerly seized upon by space-hungry families who like the combina-

tion of practicality and good looks.

Space? With the back seat in position the Escort Estate gives you 31 cubic feet of stowage space, plus four full seats. Lower the back seats and it turns into 54 cubic feet of solid, usable space. In practical terms that means everybody can take what they like with them on holiday. Or you can go picnicking or camping without skimping on creature comforts. Or you can carry the kids plus dog without anyone having to suffer discomfort. Or simply that you can use your Escort Estate for both business and pleasure.

We've been talking about the Escort Estate, but

there are three models to choose from: Escort Estate, Escort L Estate, and Escort XL Estate. Each version is equipped and trimmed to similar standards as their saloon equivalents (with carpeting in the load area as well on Escort XL). The tailgate is counterbalanced and top-hinged to stay open without struts.

Of course, we're well aware that an estate is likely to be worked harder than its saloon equivalent. And

we've made allowances for it.

If you choose the 1300cc model, then servo assisted front disc and rear drum brakes will be fitted as standard. Wider tyres and wheels are standard.

The owner of the 1300L opposite is, appropriately enough an estate agent. He needs the extra space which the Escort provides for his business. A van isn't necessary and saloon cars just aren't versatile enough.

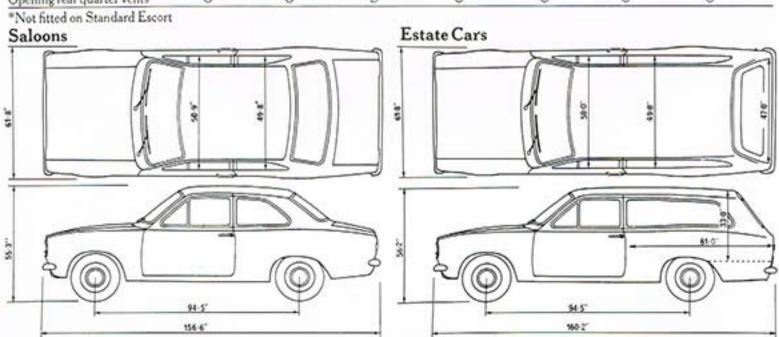
The Escort Estate fills the bill perfectly.
