The Viva line for '69 goes on – now totals 26 success-styled variants. Viva, **Viva de Luxe**(4-door model illustrated), and all Viva '69 models have more refinement than ever.

There's a new facia layout, new safety armrests, and an energy-absorbing safety steering column.

Viva prices start at £657 11s 8d Automatic transmission £86 17s 10d extra, on de Luxe models. Viva's sports car handling is standard.



Viva SL (4-door model illustrated), like Viva de Luxe, comes in four lively versions. Choose from regular 1159 cc (56 bhp) or '90' 1159 cc (69 bhp). or Brabham '90' (79 bhp), or 1599 cc (83 bhp). Viva 90 and 1600 models have power-disc brakes and low-profile tyres – plus Viva's snap-action 4-speed gears.

Viva SL prices start at £762 7s 3d Automatic transmission £86 17s 10d extra. Viva's light-but-light controls are standard.





Super-luxury Viva SL (2-door model illustrated) has Viva's crisp styling, compact dimensions – and 16 cubic foot boot.

Both have safety-styled interiors – bench seats front and rear in Vynide for Victor; individual-style seating in Ambla for Victor 2000.
