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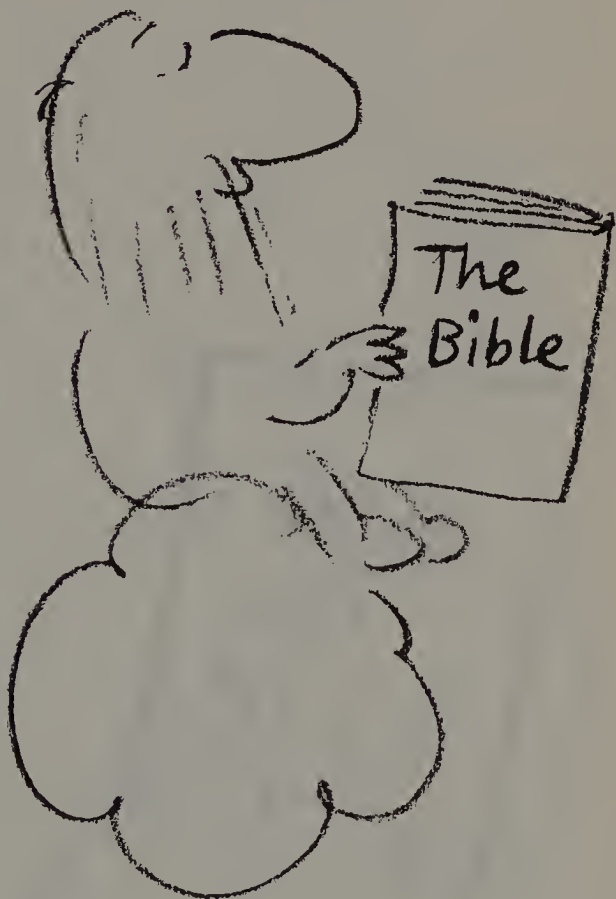
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To My God -

they love me.:



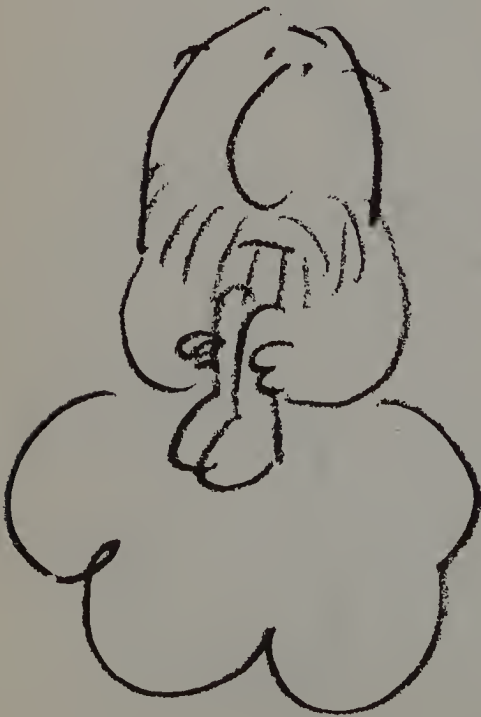




I think I've lost my

someone to pray to?

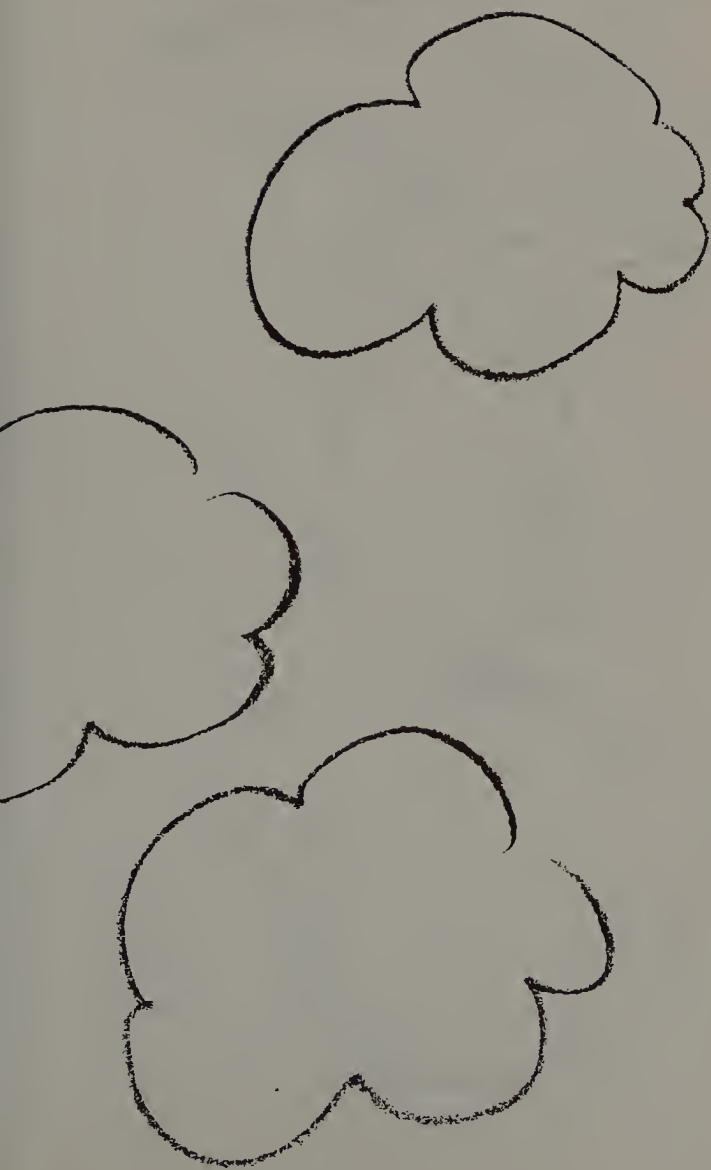


Help me! Help! Please

I made a come-back..

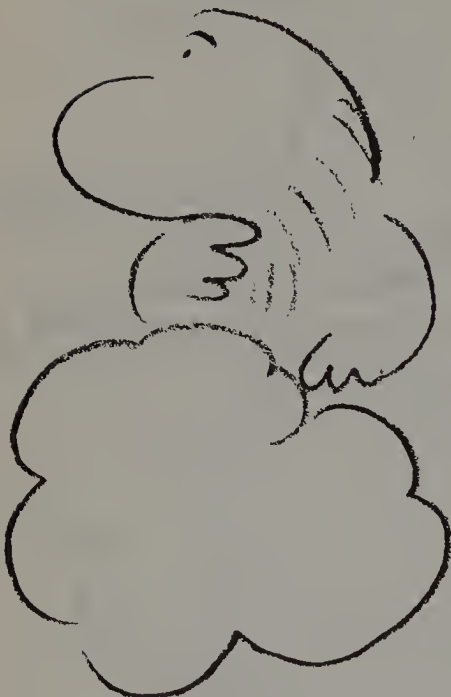


I don't seem to be



your old job back

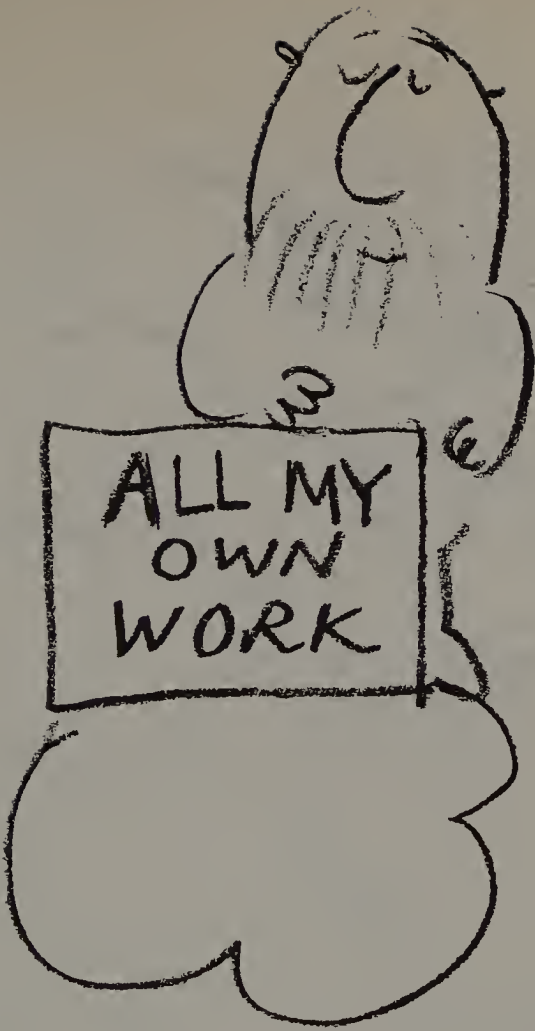




Love one another

and thump you!!!







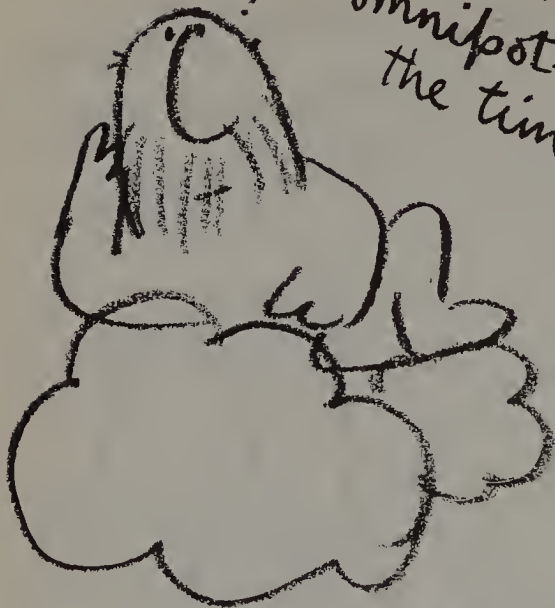


I'd like to retire -

feel so insecure...





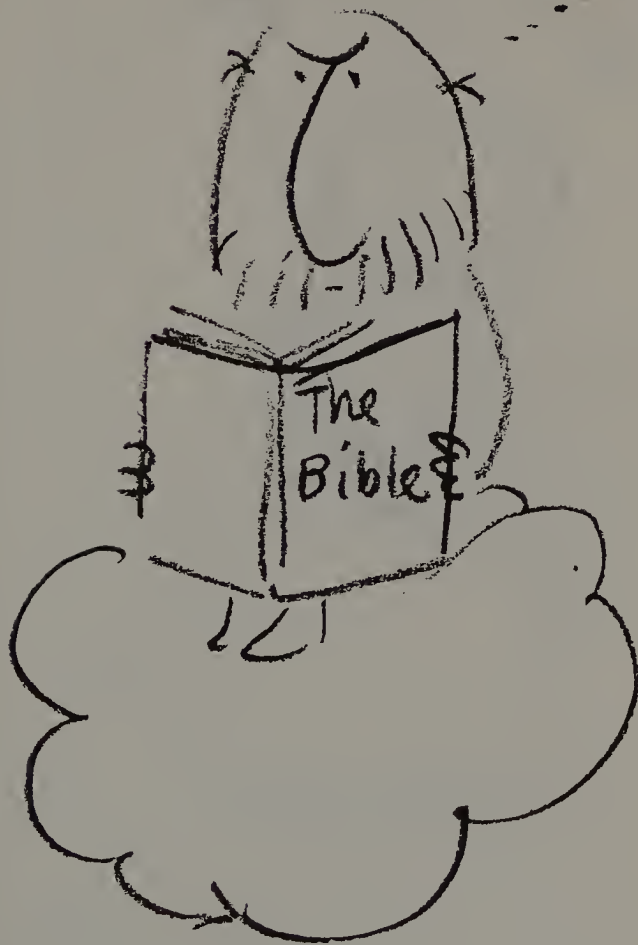


Somedays everything

I've been misquoted



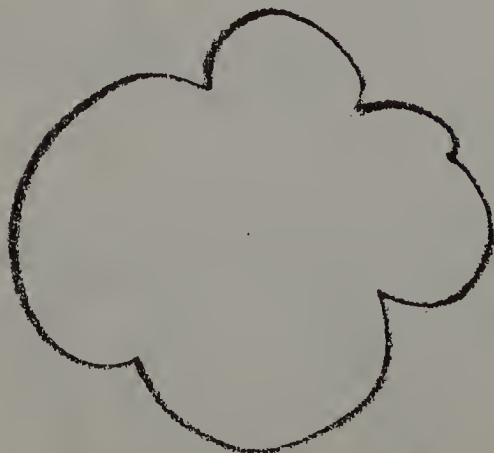
I should have known -

one job.

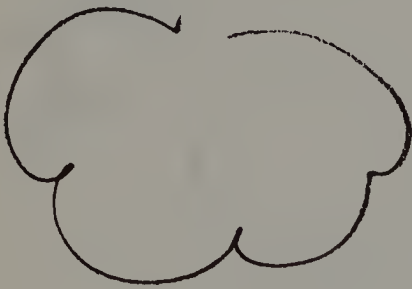


I think I can say -

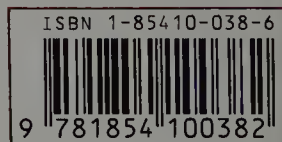
